As an Advocacy Intern or Fellow at Justice Revival, you'll be advocating for full equality under the U.S. Constitution, through a history-making campaign for the Equal Rights Amendment.

Justice Revival is a diverse, inclusive community of Christian faith and a leading voice for human rights in the United States. We inspire people of faith with knowledge and understanding of human rights and unite with them to promote a nation and culture free from injustice.

The Mobilizing & Organizing Intern or Fellow will play a significant role in advancing the #Faith4ERA campaign to amplify faith support for the ERA. This role will involve responsibility for engaging faith leaders, denominations, and other faith organizations and coalitions in support of the ERA.

Responsibilities

- Develop and maintain a thorough understanding of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) and the social movement in support of the ERA

- Conduct outreach to faith leaders, denominations, and faith organizations and coalitions, in order to recruit additional partners and allies for the #Faith4ERA campaign
- Onboard and provide support to new #Faith4ERA campaign partners
- Develop and coordinate grass-roots advocacy actions (such as Tweet storms and letter campaigns), engaging #Faith4ERA campaign partners
- Help coordinate and facilitate #Faith4ERA campaign meetings

Required Qualifications

- At least two years of college required; Bachelors' degree preferred; graduate education (in ministry, law, public policy, etc.) welcome
- Background in human rights, civil rights, social justice ministry, or community organizing preferred
- Strong oral and written communication and interpersonal skills
- Strong self-management and organizational skills; attention to detail
- Ability and desire to work with diverse, multi-cultural faith communities
- Willingness and ability to prioritize Justice Revival
- Initiative, creativity, flexibility, and an entrepreneurial spirit
- A contagious passion for our cause
